



MINI-LESSON 1: THE ALPHABET & PRONUNCIATION TIPS

Objective

Learn the English alphabet and practice key pronunciation points, especially for commonly confused letters.

The English Alphabet

A B C D E F G
H I J K L M N
O P Q R S T
U V W X Y Z

There are **26 letters** in the English alphabet.
Each letter has a **name** and a **sound**.

Pronunciation Tips

Letter	How You Say It	Common Confusion
A	/ 'eɪ /	Sounds like “hey”
E	/ 'iː /	Don't confuse with “I”
I	/ 'aɪ /	Sounds like “eye”
O	/ 'oʊ /	Like “go”
U	/ 'juː /	Like “you”
G	/ 'dʒiː /	Sounds like “gee”
J	/ 'dʒeɪ /	Like “juice”
Y	/ 'waɪ /	Like “why”



Examples: Spelling Practice

Tip: Watch Out!
