

## MINI LESSON 12: THE VERB "CAN" (ABILITY & PERMISSION)



Learn how to use the modal verb can to express ability and permission in everyday situations.

- **Explanation**
- **CAN** = Ability

We use can to talk about what someone is able to do.

- I can swim.
- She can speak three languages.
- They can play the guitar.

## **CAN** = Permission

We also use can to ask for or give permission.

- Can I go to the bathroom?
- You can borrow my book.
- Can we eat in this room?

## 

- The base form of the verb always follows **can** (no *to* or -s):



- He can drives. (X)
- For the negative, use can't or cannot.



#### **Ability**

- I can dance.
- He can't cook.
- We can run fast.

#### **Permission**

- Can I open the window?
- Yes, you can.
- No, you can't.
