

## MINI LESSON 14: MUCH, MANY, SOME, ANY, A LOT OF



Learn how to use **much**, **many**, **some**, **any**, and **a lot of** correctly with countable and uncountable nouns.

# **Explanation**

## **✓** Countable vs. Uncountable Reminder

- Countable nouns: things we can count (books, apples, chairs)
- Uncountable nouns: things we cannot count (water, rice, information)

# 🗱 Usage

Word	Use With	Sentence Example
much	uncountable nouns	I don't have <b>much</b> time.
many	countable nouns	Are there <b>many</b> people at the party?
some	both (positive)	I have <b>some</b> money. / She has <b>some</b> apples.
any	both (negatives/questions)	Do you have <b>any</b> friends? / We don't need <b>any</b> sugar.
a lot of	both (informal, positive)	There are <b>a lot of</b> students in the class. / We have <b>a lot of</b> coffee.



## Notes

- Much and many are common in questions and negatives.
- **Some** is used in **positive sentences** and polite offers/requests.
- Any is used in negatives and questions.
- A lot of is informal and works with both types of nouns.
