

MINI LESSON 30: ADVERBS OF MANNER



Adverbs of manner describe **how** an action is performed. They tell us **the way** something happens or is done. Most adverbs of manner are formed by adding **-ly** to adjectives, but some adverbs have irregular forms.

Examples:

- She sings beautifully. (How does she sing? Beautifully.)
- He ran quickly. (How did he run? Quickly.)
- They worked **hard**. (How did they work? Hard.)
- The baby cried **loudly**. (How did the baby cry? Loudly.)

Forming Adverbs of Manner

- 1. Adjective + ly
 - Slow → Slowly
 - Happy → Happily
 - Careful → Carefully
- 2. Irregular Adverbs of Manner (no change in form)
 - Fast → Fast
 - Hard → Hard
