



MINI LESSON 30: ADVERBS OF MANNER

◆ What Are Adverbs of Manner?

Adverbs of manner describe **how** an action is performed. They tell us **the way** something happens or is done. Most adverbs of manner are formed by adding **-ly** to adjectives, but some adverbs have irregular forms.

Examples:

- She sings **beautifully**. (How does she sing? Beautifully.)
- He ran **quickly**. (How did he run? Quickly.)
- They worked **hard**. (How did they work? Hard.)
- The baby cried **loudly**. (How did the baby cry? Loudly.)

◆ Forming Adverbs of Manner

1. Adjective + ly

- **Slow → Slowly**
- **Happy → Happily**
- **Careful → Carefully**

2. Irregular Adverbs of Manner (no change in form)

- **Fast → Fast**
- **Hard → Hard**



- Well → Well (not good)
