



MINI-LESSON 32: "WILL" FOR PREDICTIONS & DECISIONS

Objective:

Learn how to use **"will"** to talk about spontaneous decisions and make predictions about the future.

Grammar Explanation:

We use **"will"** to express:

- **Predictions** about the future:
 - *I think it will rain tomorrow.*
- **Decisions made at the moment of speaking:**
 - *I'm tired. I'll go to bed now.*
- **Promises or offers:**
 - *Don't worry. I'll help you.*

Structure:

Subject	Will	Base Verb
I	will	call
You	will	win
He/She	will	be
We	will	come
They	will	leave

Affirmative:

She will arrive at 6 p.m.

Negative:

They won't (will not) be late.

Question:

Will you bring your laptop?
