

MINI-LESSON 32: "WILL" FOR PREDICTIONS & DECISIONS



Learn how to use **"will"** to talk about spontaneous decisions and make predictions about the future.

Grammar Explanation:

We use "will" to express:

- Predictions about the future:
 - ➤ I think it will rain tomorrow.
- Decisions made at the moment of speaking:
 - ➤ I'm tired. I'll go to bed now.

Promises or offers:

➤ Don't worry. I'll help you.

Structure:

Subject	Will	Base Verb
1	will	call
You	will	win
He/She	will	be
We	will	come
They	will	leave

✓ Affirmative:

She will arrive at 6 p.m.

X Negative:

They won't (will not) be late.

? Question:

Will you bring your laptop?
