

# MINI-LESSON 4: ARTICLES - A, AN, THE

# **Objective**

Understand how and when to use the articles a, an, and the in English.

#### What Are Articles?

Articles are small words used **before nouns**. There are two types:

- Indefinite articles: a, an
- Definite article: the

## A or An?

Use a before words that start with a consonant sound:

- a cat
- a banana
- a university (sounds like /juː/)

Use **an** before words that start with a **vowel** sound (a, e, i, o, u):

- an apple
- an hour (silent "h")
- an elephant

**Tip**: It's the **sound** that matters, not the letter.



#### The

Use **the** when talking about a **specific** person, place, or thing:

- The sun is bright.
- I saw **the** doctor.
- Let's go to **the** park. (a specific one)

We use "the" when the listener/reader knows what we are talking about.

#### No Article

We don't use an article with:

- Plural nouns when talking in general:
  - Dogs are friendly.
- Uncountable nouns in general:
  - Water is important.

## Mini Dialogue

**A:** I saw a dog in the park.

**B:** Was it a big dog?

A: Yes! The dog chased a ball.

Notice: "a dog" (new info) → "the dog" (now we know which one)

# Tip: First Mention = A/An, Second = The

#### Example:

- I saw a movie yesterday.
- The movie was amazing!

First time = "a" or "an" Second time = "the"
