Objective

Learn numbers from 1 to 100 in English and how to ask for or say a phone number clearly.

Numbers 1–20

1 – one	11 – eleven
2 – two	12 – twelve
3 – three	13 – thirteen
4 – four	14 – fourteen
5 – five	15 – fifteen
6 – six	16 – sixteen
7 – seven	17 – seventeen
8 – eight	18 – eighteen
9 – nine	19 – nineteen
10 – ten	20 – twenty

Tens: 30–100

Number	Spelling	Number	Spelling
30	thirty	31	thirty-one
40	forty	42	forty-two
50	fifty	53	fifty-three
60	sixty	64	sixty-four
70	seventy	75	seventy-five
80	eighty	86	eighty-six
90	ninety	99	ninety-nine
100	one hundred	107	one hundred and seven



Tip: Say the numbers clearly and slowly when giving a phone number.

Example: 555-9021 → *five five five, nine zero two one*

Asking for a Phone Number

Common questions:

- What's your phone number?
- Can I have your number?
- What's your mobile number?

Ways to answer:

- It's **(555) 124-7890**.
- My number is **+44 7723 000 123**.
- You can call me at **123-4567**.

Say "zero" for 0.

Speak each number individually.

For double numbers, you can say "double" (UK):

– **3377** → "double three, double seven"

Mini Dialogue

A: What's your phone number?

B: It's (212) 456-7892.

A: Is that two one two, four five six, seven eight nine two?

B: Yes, that's right!
