Tip: Say the numbers clearly and slowly when giving a phone number.

Example: 555-9021 → five five, nine zero two one

Asking for a Phone Number

Common questions:

- What's your phone number?
- Can I have your number?
- What's your mobile number?

Ways to answer:

- It's (555) 124-7890.
- My number is +44 7723 000 123.
- You can call me at 123-4567.

Say "zero" for 0.

Speak each number individually.

For double numbers, you can say "double" (UK):

- 3377 → "double three, double seven"

Mini Dialogue

B: It's (212) 456-7892.

A: Is that two one two, four five six, seven eight nine two?

B: Yes, that's right!
