

Mini-lesson 42: Conjunctions - And, But, Because, So

Objective:

To help you understand and correctly use the coordinating conjunctions **and**, **but**, **because**, and **so** to connect ideas in a sentence.

Explanation:

Conjunctions are words that connect words, phrases, or clauses. Let's look at four common ones:

✓ AND – adds similar ideas

- I like coffee and tea.
- She's kind **and** funny.

BUT – shows contrast (difference)

- I'm tired, **but** I can help.
- He likes pizza, **but** not pasta.

BECAUSE – gives a reason

- I stayed home because I was sick.
- She's happy **because** she passed the test.

✓ SO – shows a result

- I was hungry, so I ate a sandwich.
- He studied a lot, so he did well.

Notes:

- And/But connect two equal ideas.
- **Because** explains why.
- **So** explains what happened as a result.
