

Mini-lesson 44: Polite Requests and Offers (Would, Could, May)

Why Use Polite Language?

Using polite language helps you sound respectful, friendly, and professional in English. Words like **would**, **could**, and **may** make your requests and offers softer and more polite.

♦ Making Polite Requests

We use these expressions when asking someone to do something:

- **✓** Would you...?
 - Would you open the window, please?
 - Would you mind helping me?
- Could you...? / Could I...?
 - Could you pass the salt?
 - Could I borrow your pen?
- May I...? (more formal)
 - May I come in?
 - May I ask a question?



♦ Making Polite Offers

We use Would you like...? or Can I...? to offer help or something nice.

- **✓** Would you like...?
 - Would you like some coffee?
 - Would you like to sit down?
- ✓ Can I...? / May I...? (offering to do something)
 - Can I help you with your bags?
 - May I offer you a drink?
